Level 2: Responsible Person Training

This one day multi-agency training is specifically for those people identified as Responsible Persons within the City of Sunderland's Safeguarding Adults Procedural Framework.

A Responsible Person is the person who receives and considers concerns passed to them by the Alerter.

Responsible Persons are usually, therefore, operating in a supervisory capacity, often as managers, assistant managers or other such senior roles within services or agencies.

Clarity regarding the appropriateness of this course for you should be sought from your line manager, Individual Agency Guidance within the Procedural Framework or from the Safeguarding Adults Team.

Programme Aim

The overall aim of this training is to further enhance awareness and understanding of Sunderland's Safeguarding Adults Procedural Framework and, in particular, to clarify the role and responsibilities of the Responsible Person within that Framework.

Objectives

By the end of the training, course participants will be:

- confident that they understand their own values and attitudes in relation to adult abuse
- able to define the key roles and responsibilities linked to the Procedural Framework
- clear about the specific role and responsibilities of the Responsible Person

- able to practically apply the decision-making process when gathering information following an Alert
- able to identify the areas where preventative measures can be applied within their own places of work, thus promoting good practice and improving the safeguarding of service users within individual work settings
- aware of, and have greater understanding of the most up-to-date issues and information relating to Safeguarding Adults.

Training Programme

The content of the day will cover the following:

- Exploring Values and Attitudes of Abuse
- Safeguarding Adults: Development of Policy and Procedural Framework
- Categories, Signs and Symptoms of Abuse
- Key Roles and Responsibilities
- The Responsible Person
- Decision-Making
- Next Steps in the Process
- Preventative Measures.
